

Chapter 7. The Subjunctive

It's easy to spot subjunctives when they differ from indicatives: the subjunctive verb paradigm is always very simple (see table 7.2). But it is not always easy to know what a subjunctive is doing or how to translate it, for Old English often uses the subjunctive where Modern English uses the indicative. Translate each of the following sentences, paying careful attention to the subjunctive verbs (in **bold** type). Be prepared to discuss why the subjunctive is used in each sentence. Since subjunctives often come in complex sentences, this is an advanced exercise.

1. Hit wæs gewītegod þat Crist on ðāre byrig Bethleem ācenned **wurde**.
2. Se lārēow his hīeremen¹ tō betran līfe spōn,² ðy lās hīe mid eorðlicre sorge **wurden** gebundne.
3. Sȳ se man ofslæġen þe³ ðū þīne hāðenan godas mid **finde**.
4. Gif ðū hwelcne cræft **cunne**, begā⁴ þone ȝeorne.
5. Þeah ðe hīe unlybban⁵ **drincen**, hit him ne dereð.
6. Wēne ȝē þat ȝē **mæġen** ætwindan þisum rēþan wīte?
7. Gif ðū earm **weorðe**, ȝeþenć þat ðū hit ēaðe⁶ **ȝeþolie**.
8. Mīn hlāford hēt þē biddan þat þū **cȳdde** þis spell mannum.
9. Þis ȝewrit cȳð hū folces synna ȝebētte⁷ bēon **scylen**.

1 *hīeremen*: servants, hirelings.

2 *spōn*: urged (an alternative past form of spanan).

3 Take *mid* with the relative pronoun and translate “with whom you . . .”

4 *begā*: In addition to the meanings given by the glossary for *begān*, it can mean “practice.”

5 *unlybban*: poison.

6 *ēaðe*: In addition to the meaning for this adverb in the glossary, it can mean “willingly.”

7 Past participle of *(ȝe)bētan*.

10. Bēon⁸ ȝif hīe mannan ācwallað, **cwelle** hīe man⁹ hraðe and **ete** man þæt hunig þæt hīe worhton.
11. Ȑif ðū **wille** gōdne hlīsan habban, ne fægna ðū nānes yfeles.
12. Ðā Ȑrīe cempan hine scotodon¹⁰ mid hira strālum oð þæt hē **wāre** ācweald.
13. Ic Ȑē bebēode Ȑæt ðū **bēo** ȝestrangod¹¹ and ellenrōf.
14. Ne bēoð ealle untrume for synnum geswencte, þēah þe hīe sume **bēon**.
15. Hit is mannum ȝephūht swelce sēo sunne and þā tunglas **gangen** westweard.¹²

8 *Bēon*: bees (nominative).

9 *Man* is the subject of *cwelle* and *hīe* the object.

10 *scotodon*: shot.

11 *ȝestrangod*: strengthened (i.e. strong)

12 *westweard*: towards the west.
