In poetry as in prose, you need to be able to identify the subject, object and verb (including auxiliaries and verbals) in any clause if you are to make sense of it. In the following extract from *Maxims I*, on the proper conduct of a queen, bracket each clause and mark all subjects (S), objects (O), finite verbs (F) and verbals (V).

Cyning sceal mid ċēape cwēne ġebicgan, bunum ond bēagum; bū sceolon ærest ġeofum gōd wesan. Gūð sceal in eorle, wīġ ġeweaxan, ond wif gebeon lēof mid hyre lēodum, lēohtmod wesan, rūne healdan, rūmheort bēon mēarum ond mābmum, meodorædenne, for ġesīðmæġen symle æġhwær eodor æbelinga ærest ġegrētan, forman fulle to frēan hond ricene ġeræċan, ond him ræd witan boldāgendum bæm ætsomne.
