

## ***JOHN NORTON MOORE***

John Norton Moore is a Professor of Law at the University of Virginia School of Law. He also directs the Center for National Security Law and the Center for Oceans Law and Policy at the University. He is the author or editor of twenty-eight books and over 160 scholarly articles and served for two decades on the editorial board of the *American Journal of International Law*, where he is currently an Honorary Editor. In addition to his scholarly career, Professor Moore has a distinguished record of public service. Among seven Presidential appointments, he has served two terms as the Senate-confirmed Chairman of the Board of Directors of the United States Institute of Peace and, as the first Chairman, set up this new agency. He also served as the Counselor on International Law to the Department of State, and as Ambassador and Deputy Special Representative of the President to the Law of the Sea Conference, a Member of the National Advisory Committee on Oceans and Atmosphere, Chairman of the National Security Council Interagency Task Force on the Law of the Sea, and as a Deputy Agent of the United States before the International Court of Justice in the *Nicaragua* case. He further served as the Legal Adviser to Kuwait during the Gulf War and as their Legal Adviser in the United Nations Iraq-Kuwait Boundary Demarcation Commission after the war. He prepared the first draft of what became the Community of Democracies for Freedom House. His work today focuses on the origins and control of war, democracy and the rule of law, the oceans frontier, and national security challenges.
